Margaret Crerar (Peg) Theophilus, 71 of Alpine, died Dec. 14, 1985, at Brewster Memorial Hospital following an illness.

Services were Dec. 17 at the First Presbyterian

Church with burial in Elm Grove Cemetery in Alpine under direction of Geeslin Funeral Home.

She was born April 21, 1914, in Cleveland, Ohio. She received her bachelor's and master's degrees from Sul Ross State University. She had lived in Alpine since 1943. She and her husband have operated Shopper's Guide Bookstore here for many years.

She married Oliver Theophilus Nov. 22, 1941. She was an elder in the Presbyterian Church and active in the choir there.

Survivors include her husband of Alpine; one daughter, Peggy King of Farmer's Branch; one son, Martin (Buddy) Theophilus of Austin; and eight grandchildren, Karl Karvonen, George Karvonen, Karen Karvonen, Claudia King, Paul King, Joseph King, Anthony Perez and Ken Perez.

Editor, The Alpine Avalanche:

On Dec. 14, my mother passed away following a brief illness. It would be impossible to individually thank all those who offered their support and caring to my family during this difficult time.

Initially my wife and I were convinced that my mother should be moved to a "big city" hospital. We quickly realized the medical care and especially the love could occur only in Alpine. We deeply appreciated the work of all the medical staff at Brewster Memorial Hospital, and in particular Dr. Daugherty who provided continuous "down to earth" medical reports to all of us.

All our family was deeply touched by those who stayed near us day and night, the food that was brought by, and the many folks who expressed their love for Peg and Ollie.

There is one incident involving my mother that those who knew her will appreciate. Peg accompanied my wife Chris and I to her home in England in November. After spending a few days with us, she set out on her own through London, to Wales and Scotland to research the family and share her Big Bend fossil collection with a few of England's universities. Before returning to Sudbury she stopped at Cambridge University and decided to part with a few of her better specimens. She was asked to sign page 22 of a leather bound, gold edged book for those who donate to Cambridge. The university's representatives shared page one with Peg, which included the signature of King Henry VI who donated land for Cambridge. She was so excited and proud when she told us about her experience. We are all so very proud of her.

It seems especially the last year and a half were filled with special experiences. She was always so excited about Alpine, the Big Bend, and its history...its people.

Most of all, I just wanted everyone to know how much their thoughts and prayers meant to us. My parents have always expressed their joy in having lived in Alpine.

Peg wrote the Avalanche several months ago and related the story of their arrival in Alpine in 1943. In the story she spoke of West Texas hospitality and of someone leaving warm food and the heat on when they arrived one cold night. As I read through cards of sympathy last week, one in particular touched me. It was from a new neighbor who also mentioned Peg had brought them food and other items when they first arrived.

The love and hospitality continues...!

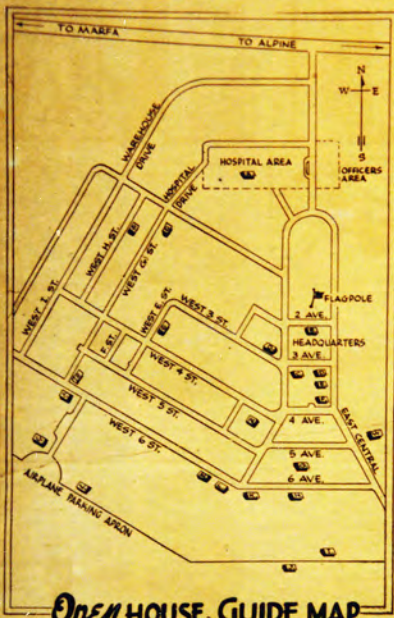

Where We've Worked At Maaf



Based on the series of letters to MAAP and ground reports from a group of individuals present the first three of you when their letters were published, and since they were being put up, the committee are to publish your names and to show you some of the places you worked in.

To the left is Maaf Army Air Field as a whole, with the location of all the headquarters buildings and auxiliary buildings. It's the same location, roughly, to all details.

Underneath the letters to the far right is the MAAP Women's Club. An organization which has done much not only for themselves, the wives of MAAP officers, but also for the field in general. During the three emergency when the red cross called for some work, the club pitched in with all they had, and working nearly for many hours, for extended the work load of them. In addition, they have made numerous provisions for the children on the field, such as a small toy nursery, taking care of diaper emergencies for infants, etc. It was through their efforts that the women's ward in the hospital was renovated and certain arrangements made for progressive modernity which made things a little more easy and pleasant. Their cooperation in the War Bond drives has been more than adequate, and they have always extended their gifts.

In addition to these specific activities, the MAAP Women's Club has been the major factor in bringing these women together, and having them function as a unit in their social and leisure activities.



Directly under the map is a picture of the post theater, a place that was probably responsible for more movie watching than any other place on the field. We got all the first run pictures, with most good short subjects and a minimum of low-budget. Thanks to Sgt. Cashell for the letter.

To the right is the Civil Detachment building, where staff represented the first function of Maaf Army Air Field. It was built primarily to house the 1,300 ground units that have come out of MAAP, and their families can be seen in the very number that received their mail.

Bottom left is the MAAP tower, probably manufacturing the Director of Training Office. The actual preparation and execution of the letter by breaking the necessary papers and getting them through, really with the assistance of an advanced team, might not be...

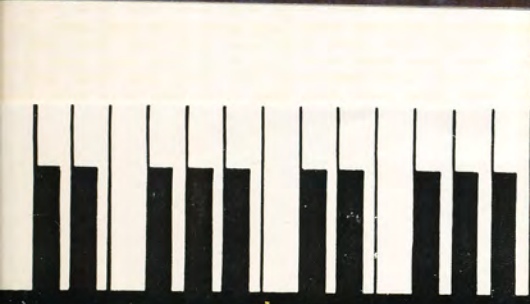
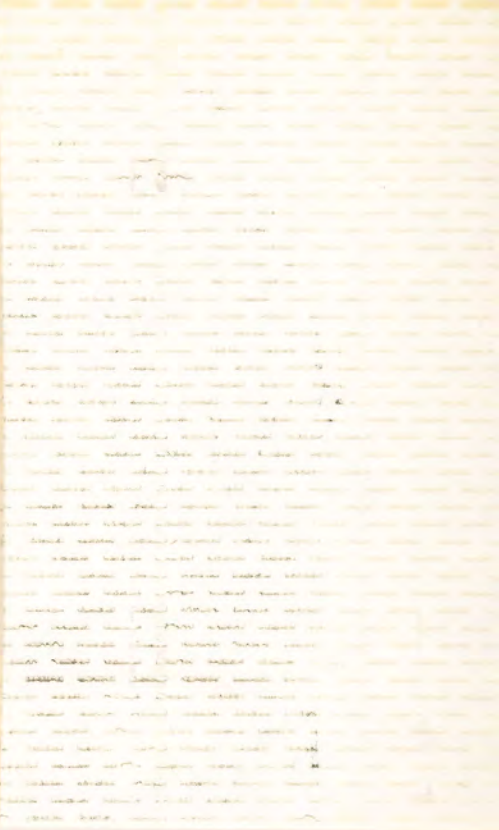






Theophilus is creative volunteer

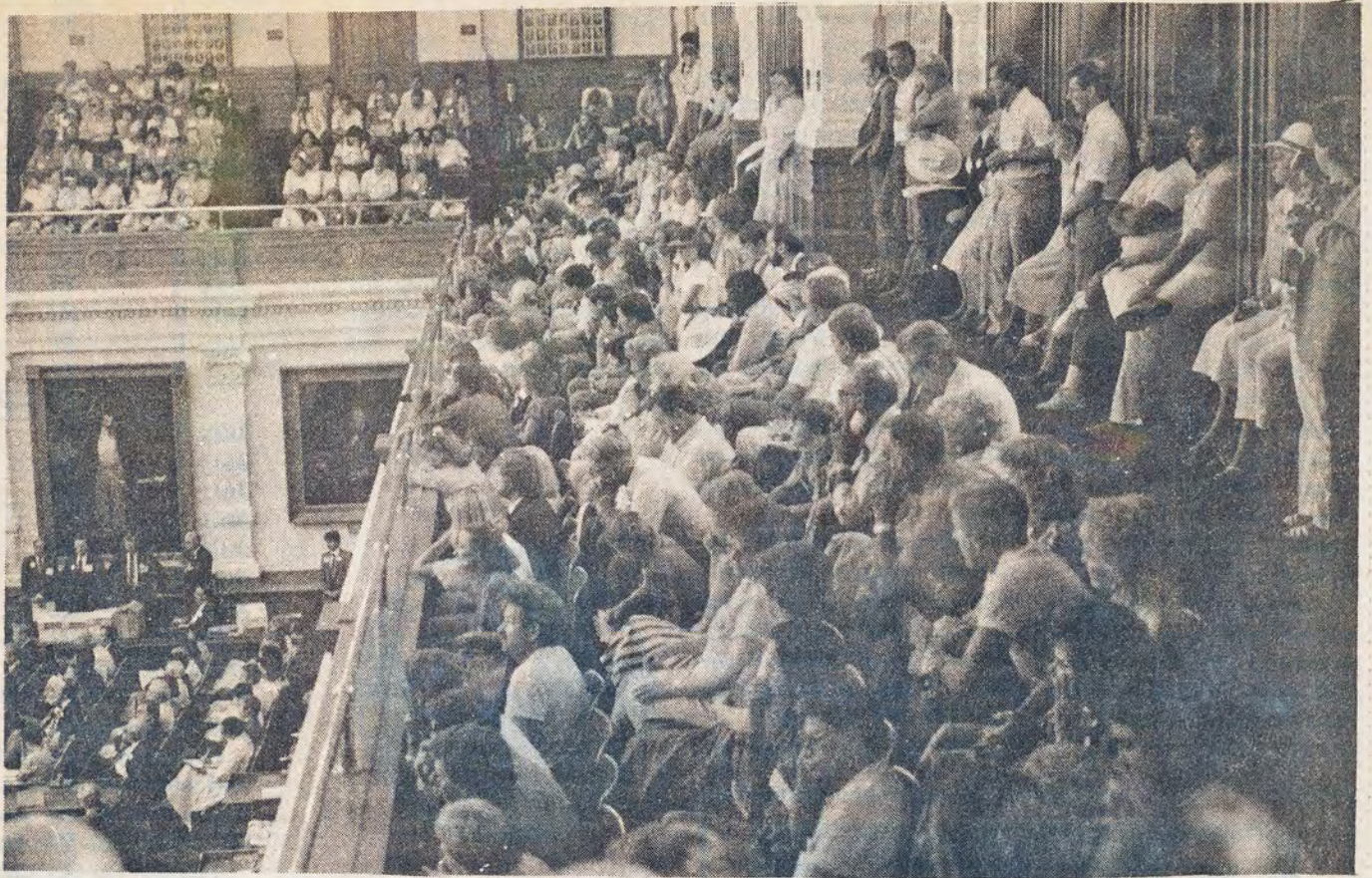

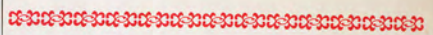

## Human Services set for layoffs

The Texas Department of Human Services has begun to trim its payroll by 200 positions to meet anticipated reductions in the agency's budget, which is being cut as the Legislature tries to overcome a projected \$2.8 billion deficit.

So far, no one in the agency has been told not to return to work, Human Services Commissioner Marlin Johnston said on Friday.

Although the reduction in staff will not be completed until late October, Johnston said, employees whose jobs will be abolished will be notified in the next week.

"Right now we don't know how many people will be laid off," he said. "Some people already know they're in a function (position) that

will be deleted."

The number of jobs being cut is based on the assumption that the House-Senate conference committee on spending revisions will cut no deeper than what was proposed by the Senate.

The Senate voted to trim the agency's budget by abolishing about 200 jobs. The House proposed cuts that translate into a loss of 404 positions. When the legislation was considered in both chambers, it was assumed that no layoffs would result and that the work force could be reduced through attrition.

The conference committee resumes work at 2 p.m. Sunday trying to reach a compromise on the budget cuts, which are part of the effort by lawmakers to bring spending into line with revenues.

Johnston said he could not afford

to wait until the conferees finish work. "The longer I wait to get something in place, the more (layoffs) it will take to take care of the problem," he said.

The commissioner said the reduction in force will be limited to the agency's state headquarters and 10 regional offices. Vacant positions will be abolished first, he said.

Anyone whose post is being abolished will be offered help to find a job, Johnston said.

Meanwhile, the head of the Texas Public Employees Association said that agency employees spared this time should organize to head off further reductions.

"Maybe the DHS dismissals will make many state employees more aware of what is happening at the Capitol," said Gary Hughes.
