# Marfa prepares for "Lights" festival

Ethnically diverse music will highlight the 1992 Marfa Lights festival concert.

Performers who are scheduled to appear include Tish Hinojosa, Craig Carter and the Spur of the Moment Band, Los Tejanos de San Angelo and Backburner.

The four-band concert is scheduled to be held from 6 p.m. to midnight on Saturday, Sept. 5 at Zcaino Park.

Other activities and entertainment that will be held as part of the Sixth Annual Marfa Lights Festival, have been announced for the celebration to be held over the three-day Labor Day holiday period.

The festival will begin at 8 p.m. on Friday, Sept. 4, with a street dance located next to the Presidio County Courthouse at which the country and western music of Texas Brass will be featured.

Second-day activities are scheduled to begin early Saturday morning and include a wide range of activities.

At 8 a.m., the Marfa Rotary Club golf tournament and a 'Fun Run for the Lights' will both begin.

The golf tournament will be held at the Marfa Golf Course and the Run will be held beginning at the courthouse.

At 10 a.m., the courthouse lawn

and provide activities including games, music, entertainment, food and arts and crafts booths.

The annual parade will begin to wind through downtown Marfa at 11 a.m. and will conclude at the courthouse.

Activities will continue at the courthouse through the day including a washer tournament, cow chip bingo and entertainment by Mexican folkloric dancers from Ojinaga.

A Marfa roping club has also scheduled to sponsor a roping event at the arena.

Third-day activities will begin at 8 a.m. on Sunday with the continuation of the golf tournament and a Marfa 4-H Club sponsored play-day at the arena.

Booths at the courthouse will be open from 1 to 6 p.m., during which time the Viva El Paso dancers will perform.

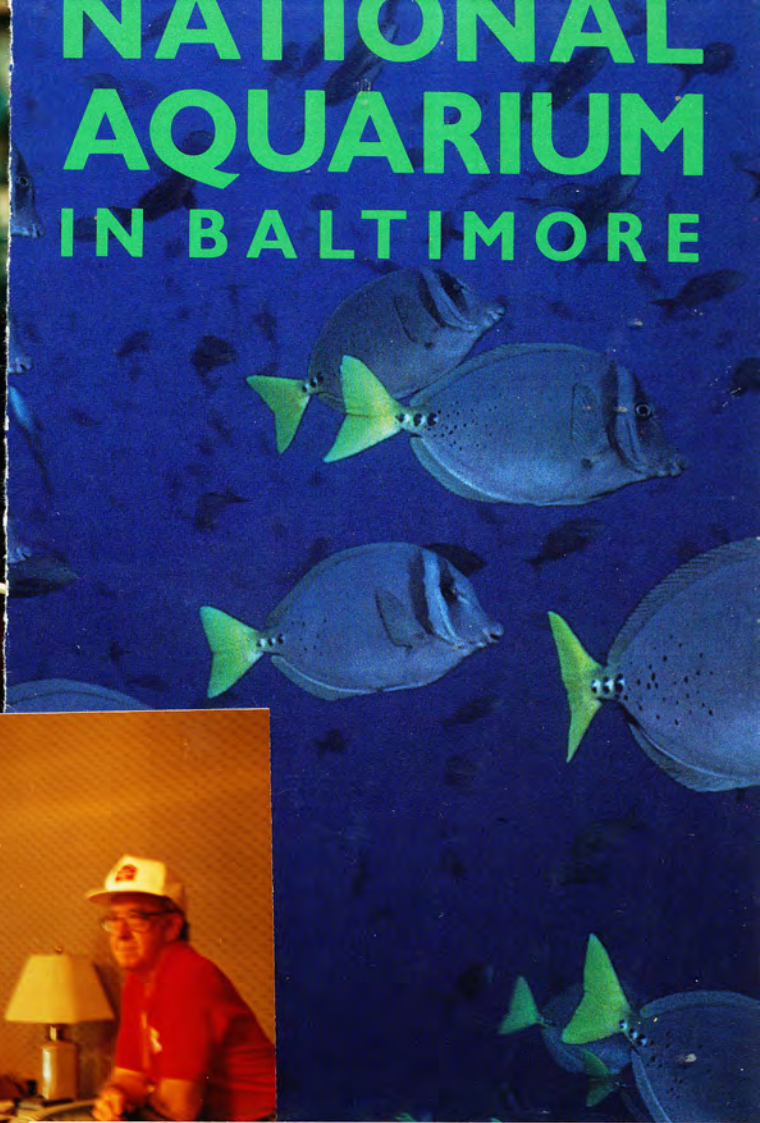

# Buda balloonist rises in world-class competition

Setting a hot-air balloon aloft is a quickly executed operation.

On a cold morning recently, Dan Sherrill's crew arrived just before daybreak at Zilker Park. Bundled up in warm jackets and gloves, six people helped unload the deflated balloon, wicker basket and burner in the soccer field.

Each person had a task and within 20 minutes, the balloon, basket and four passengers were rising over the city with the sun. Rising, except for a small dip into the Colorado River to initiate — and wet the feet — of the first-timer aboard.

Balloon pilot Sherrill has been flying hot-air balloons for almost 13 years. Whether he's following the wind currents, dipping for a "splash-and-dash" into the Colorado River, or making a feather-light landing in someone's pasture, Sherrill is in control.

Sherrill was chosen as a member of the 1989 U.S. team competing in the Hot Air Balloon World Championships in Saga, Japan, in November.

"You haven't lived until you've flown competition with Dan," his crew members say.

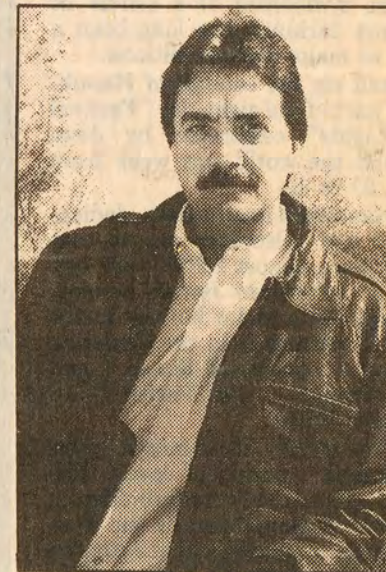
The competition in Japan was Sherrill's first world championship contest. He and his crew he came in 14th in a field of 103 pilots and were ranked 5th among the Americans. Sherrill qualified as part of the 12-member U.S.

team based on a national ranking system, getting points in competitions all over the country.

"Competition is navigation," Sherrill said. "It's a navigational-style task, rather than racing, and that means the pilot will have to complete some task, such as dropping a marker in a specific place, set by the judges."

Sherrill, 39, lives in Buda with his wife, Linda, and 4-year-old son, Nathan. He is self-employed, the owner of two barbecue restaurants in Kyle and Manchaca. He

also has a hot-air balloon business, American Balloon Corp., is the representative for Cameron Balloons in Central and Southwest Texas, and teaches a class in ballooning at Austin Community College.

Sherrill said he and his crew will go to the Soviet Union in May for two exhibitions, one in Moscow and one in Leningrad.

Sherrill said he took his first flight in a hot-air balloon in August of 1977, while a student at the University of Tennessee in

Knoxville. He saw a balloon over the city, followed it and talked the pilot into letting him be part of the crew. From then on, he was hooked. He received his commercial pilot's license in 1978 and now flies balloons both for pleasure and for pay.

Sherrill is a member, past president and founder of the Central Texas Ballooning Association, which has 120 members made up of crew members, students, balloon enthusiasts and about 30 pilots. He organized the Austin

Balloon race in 1984, the Austin Balloonfest in 1989 and a balloon race in Hondo in 1989.

Interest in hot-air ballooning runs high in Austin, he said, because it is a good area for the sport. His classes at ACC so far have attracted about 40 students, he said.

"We balloon year-round here, because even when it gets cold, it's warmer aloft," Sherrill said. "There are very few days we can't go up."

## Homecoming 1986

Two homecomings in one year?

That may well be the case in 1986 according to Sul Ross President Jack W. Humphries.

"It is difficult to imagine a homecom-

ing any more successful than the one in Austin July 10 when between 800 and 1,000 SRSU friends and alums converged on the Capitol to support Sul Ross in a hearing before the Select Com-

mittee on Higher Education," he said.

Yet plans for the Oct. 3-4 Homecoming in Alpine on the university campus promise to attract an even greater representation of Lobo friends and ex-students.

"We are doing several things different this year," Humphries said. "First, we have benefited greatly from the work of a homecoming committee chaired by Bob Posey, dean of Student Life.

"The committee met several times during the late spring and summer to make plans for Homecoming and to develop a meaningful schedule of activities. The committee's job will be year round in that no sooner will one homecoming end than the planning process for another will begin. The committee includes faculty, student, ex-student and community representation."

He said that in addition to new activities, a number of practices from past years were being reinstated. "This year we will have class reunions for the classes whose graduation year ends with a six: '26, '36, '46, '56, '66 and '76. Similar reunions were held up until several years ago. We feel that the reinstatement of class reunions will be tremendously important to the success of Homecoming in the future."

Dear Friends of Sul Ross State:

Welcome to Sul Ross State University's sixty-seventh year of providing educational opportunity for students throughout the United States! There were times this year in which we had doubts about what the future would hold for Sul Ross; and admittedly, there remains serious concern about funding at the State level for 1986-87. So let me provide a brief progress report and then direct your attention to several activities.


The rumblings from the State Capitol and State officials about closing Sul Ross have subsided, many thanks to you. The July 10 hearing before the Select Committee on Higher Education was a success in every respect, with the Committee voting unanimously against closure. The University's success before that group was ensured by the direct involvement of the hundreds of Sul Ross friends and alumni throughout the country.

The crisis at hand relates directly to the willingness of the State of Texas to continue to support its educational institutions during a time of economic recession. Several proposals under consideration would have a dreadful impact upon the University, requiring such extreme measures as the employee layoffs, the reduction of course offerings, a sharp curtailment of the summer programs, and the outright elimination of several programs and services. No decision on funding has been reached thus far by the State Legislature; but it is apparent that any farsighted solution must deal with the need for additional revenue. So we await the action of the Legislature before proceeding with serious planning for instructional offerings for next spring and summer.

Now, some great news! Enrollment is up in Alpine at least three percent to a total exceeding 1,700. The count continues, but the upward trend is well established.

Homecoming '86! Mark your calendars for October 3-4 and plan to be here. This newsletter gives details about Homecoming activities: the Hall of Honor banquet, the class reunions, the SR lighting and bonfire, and the Lobos vs. Tarleton State, and the list continues. 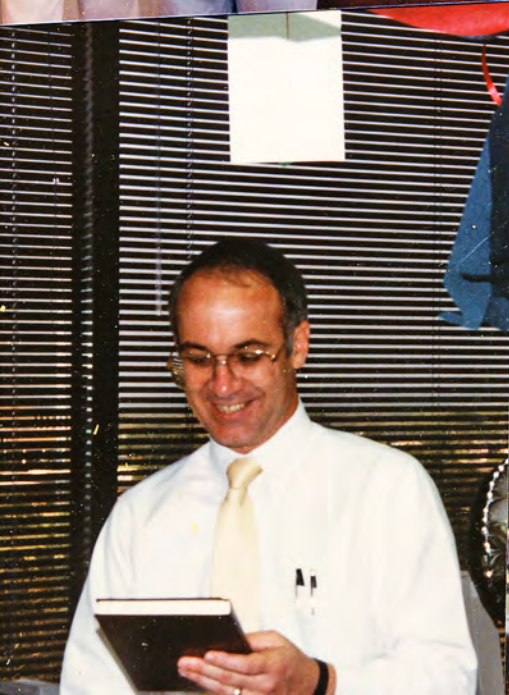

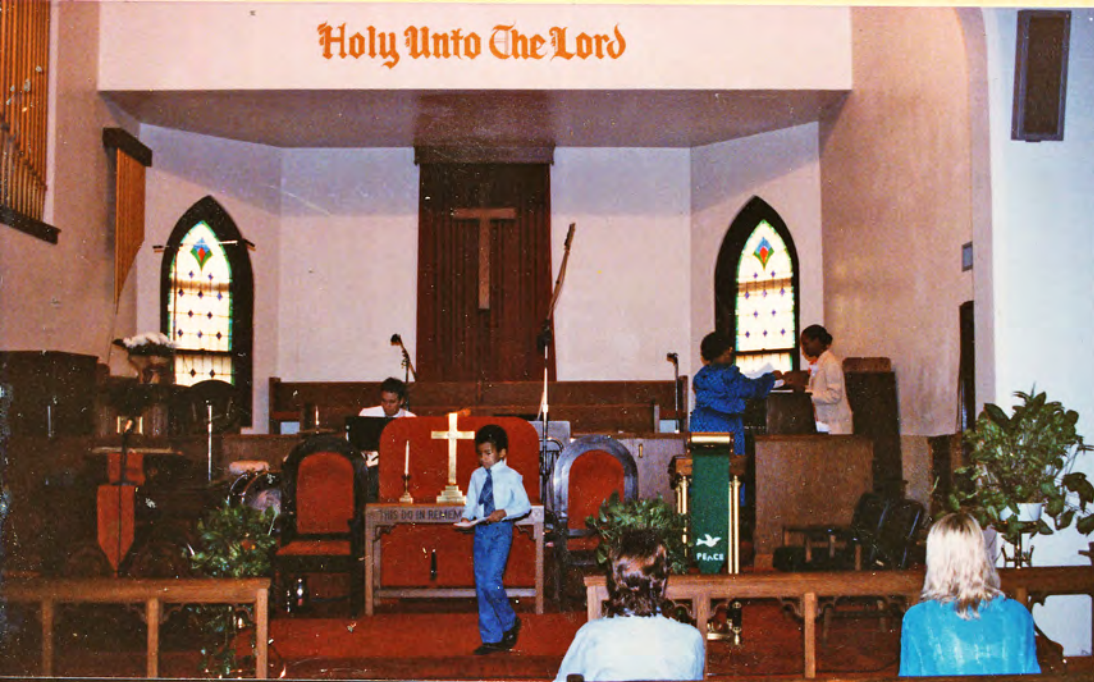
