With expectancy, Ollie waited for his stooge, planted at the end, to ask the question.

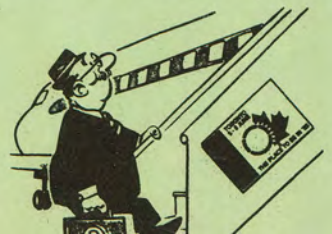
"Why, in heaven's name," came from Ronnie, "would they make you wear two pair of socks?"

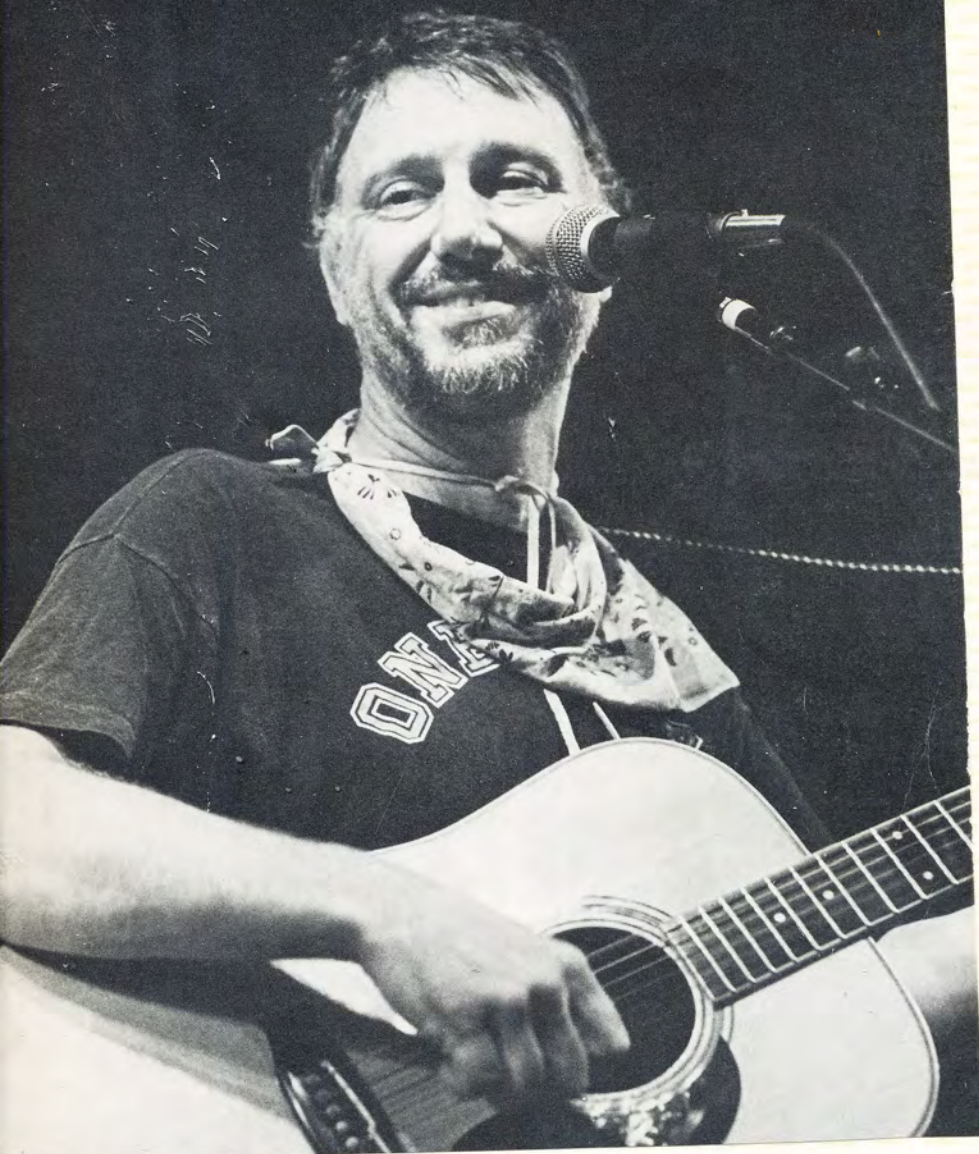

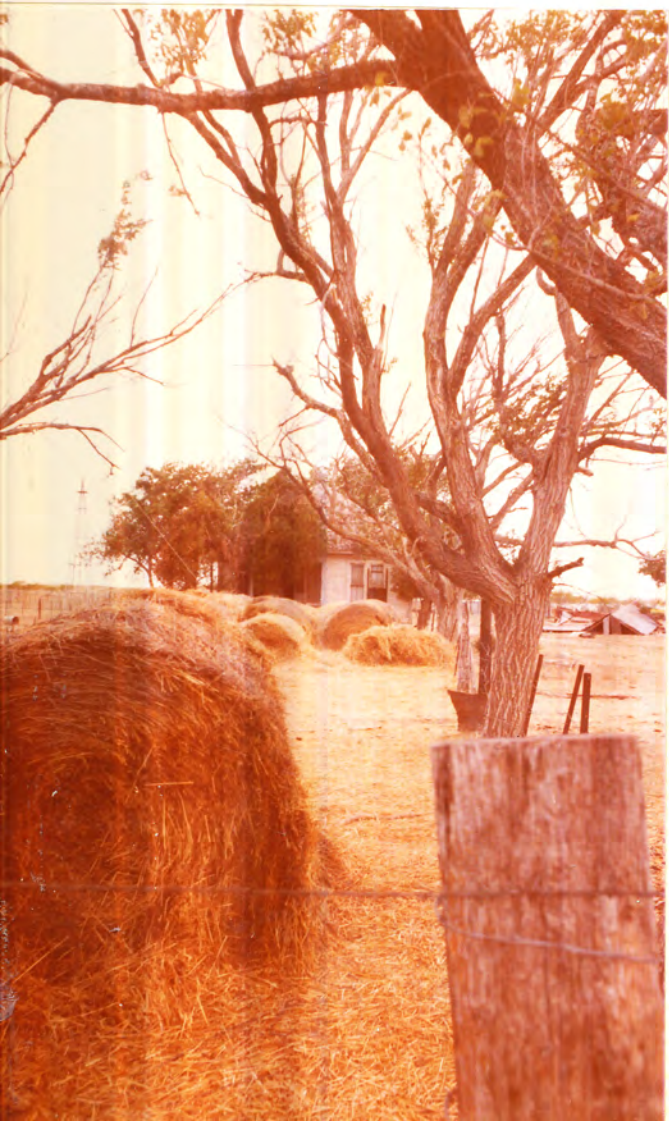

Ex-firefighter helps woman, neighbors during house fire

A former firefighter was praised today for following an odor through an Austin neighborhood early Sunday until he found a house with smoke curling from the roof.

Inside the house at 5802 Marilyn Drive, Dorothy Jamar, 70, had just awakened and thought she smelled smoke. She searched around the house until she heard a crackling noise behind a wall, and called the Fire Department about 3:15 a.m.

"I had barely put down the phone and grabbed a robe and some shoes" when Martin Theophilus came to her door, Jamar said today. "I went outside. Within seconds this big flame went up. Had I not waked up, that boy would have saved my life, probably."

THEOPHILUS, who works for the state Department of Human Resources, told Jamar and her neighbors that he had been a firefighter in Alpine in West Texas.

Theophilus told Jamar he was driving south on MoPac Boulevard when he smelled smoke. He followed the odor to the neighborhood east of MoPac and north of Northland Drive, and drove around until he saw smoke curling up from Jamar's roof.

After Theophilus made sure she was out of the house, he went to the neighbors' house to make sure they were awake, Jamar said.

Theophilus could not be reached this morning.

Jamar moved back to her native Austin eight months ago after liv-

ing in Spain for 12 years and Venezuela for 18 years prior to that.

She had filled her house with furniture she bought in Spain and with figurines, paintings and knicknacks from Spain and Venezuela, where she worked for Gulf Oil.

Most of it was destroyed or charred. She does not know if anything can be saved.

"In a 70-year lifetime, especially the last 50 years, you accumulate so many treasures," she said.

BEFORE SHE left the house, Jamar automatically grabbed her purse.

"I think living abroad for so long — you don't leave your yard without identification papers," she said.

Some of her clothes, including two furs, were rescued by firefighters before they hacked through her closet ceilings to get to the fire in the attic.

"They grabbed up all they could, including those two furs, and draped them over the fence," Jamar said.

The fire apparently started in an electrical outlet, fire officials said.

JAMAR SAID she has insurance but has not added up the loss yet.

The fire at Jamar's house was one of two house fires early Sunday.

A house at 912 Mansell Ave. in East Austin and its contents were heavily damaged by a fire that was reported at 3:24 a.m.

The Mansell Avenue fire is under investigation. Fire officials estimated damage at \$15,000.
