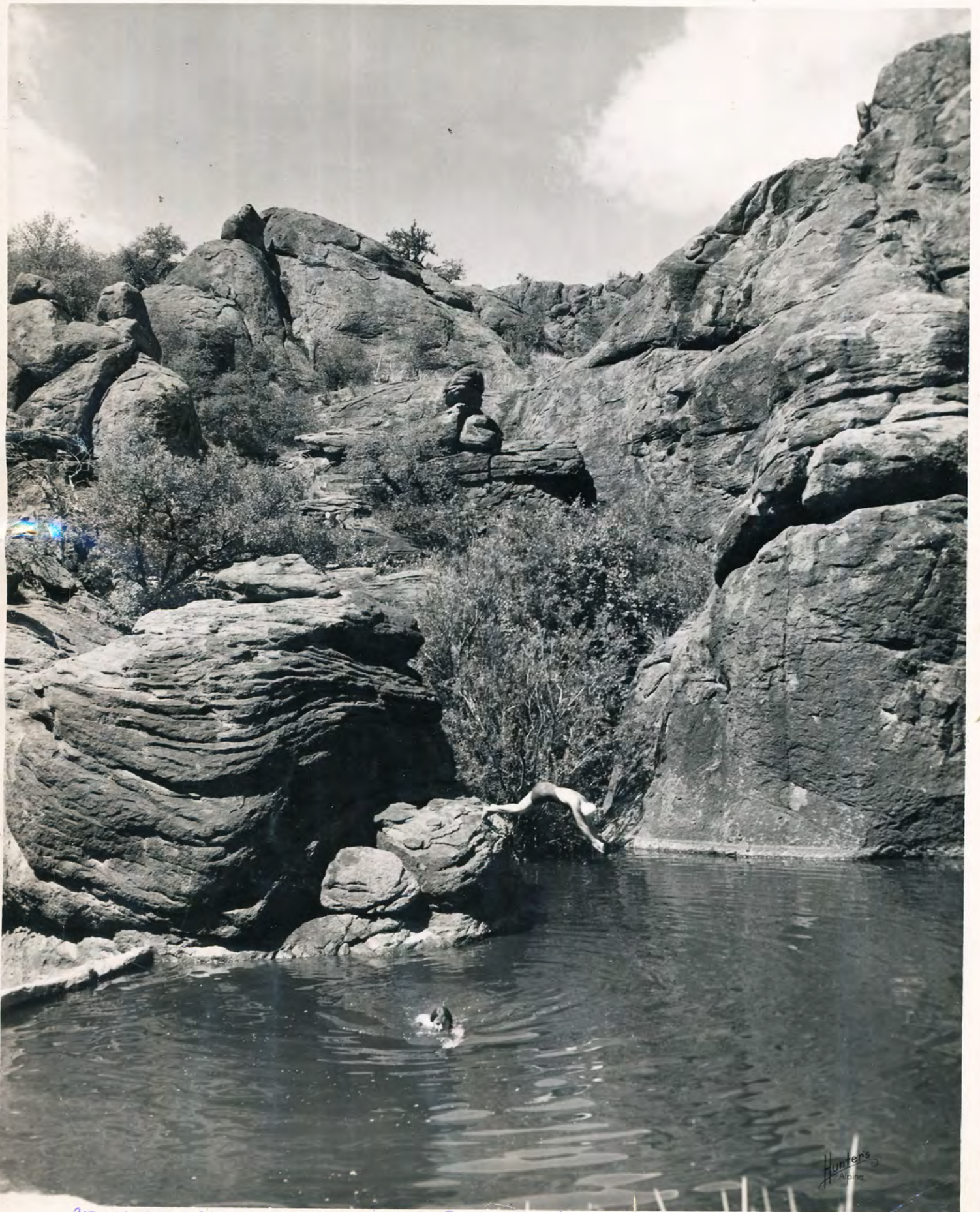

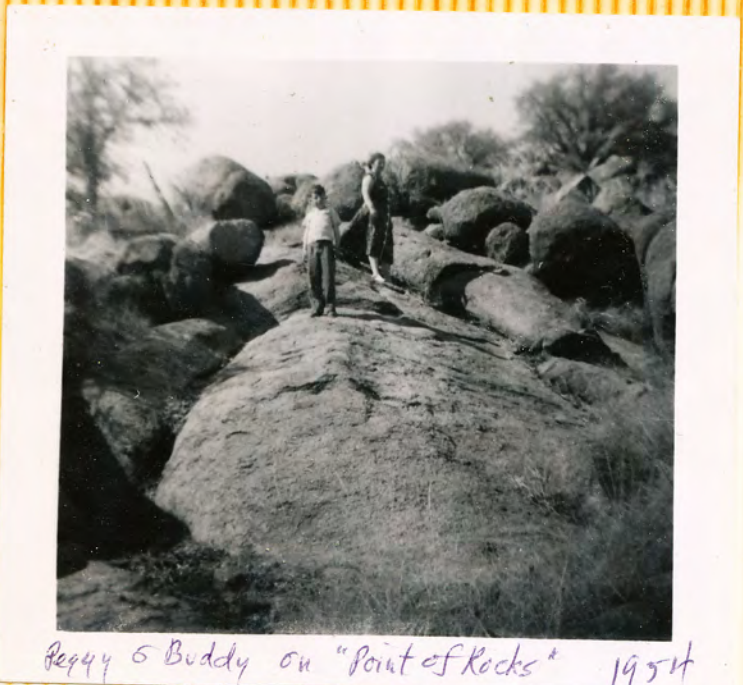

The Buck band has enjoyed a highly successful season this year and has performed some of the

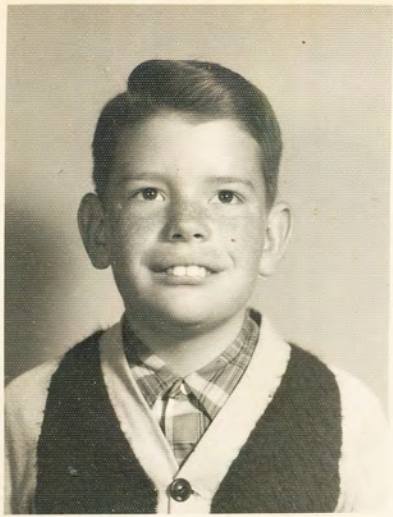
most unique and difficult drills and maneuvers that the football fans of Alpine have ever witnessed on the high school field.

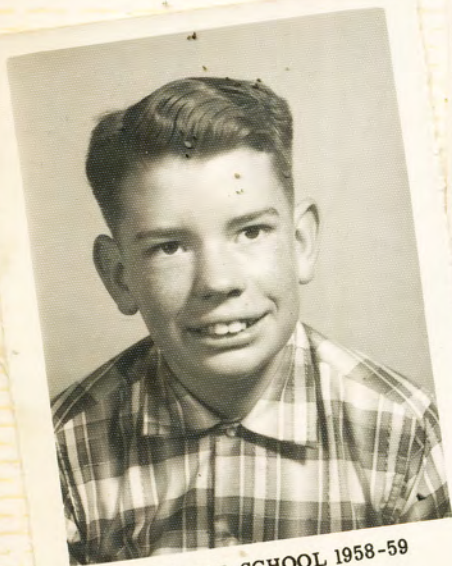

1956-57

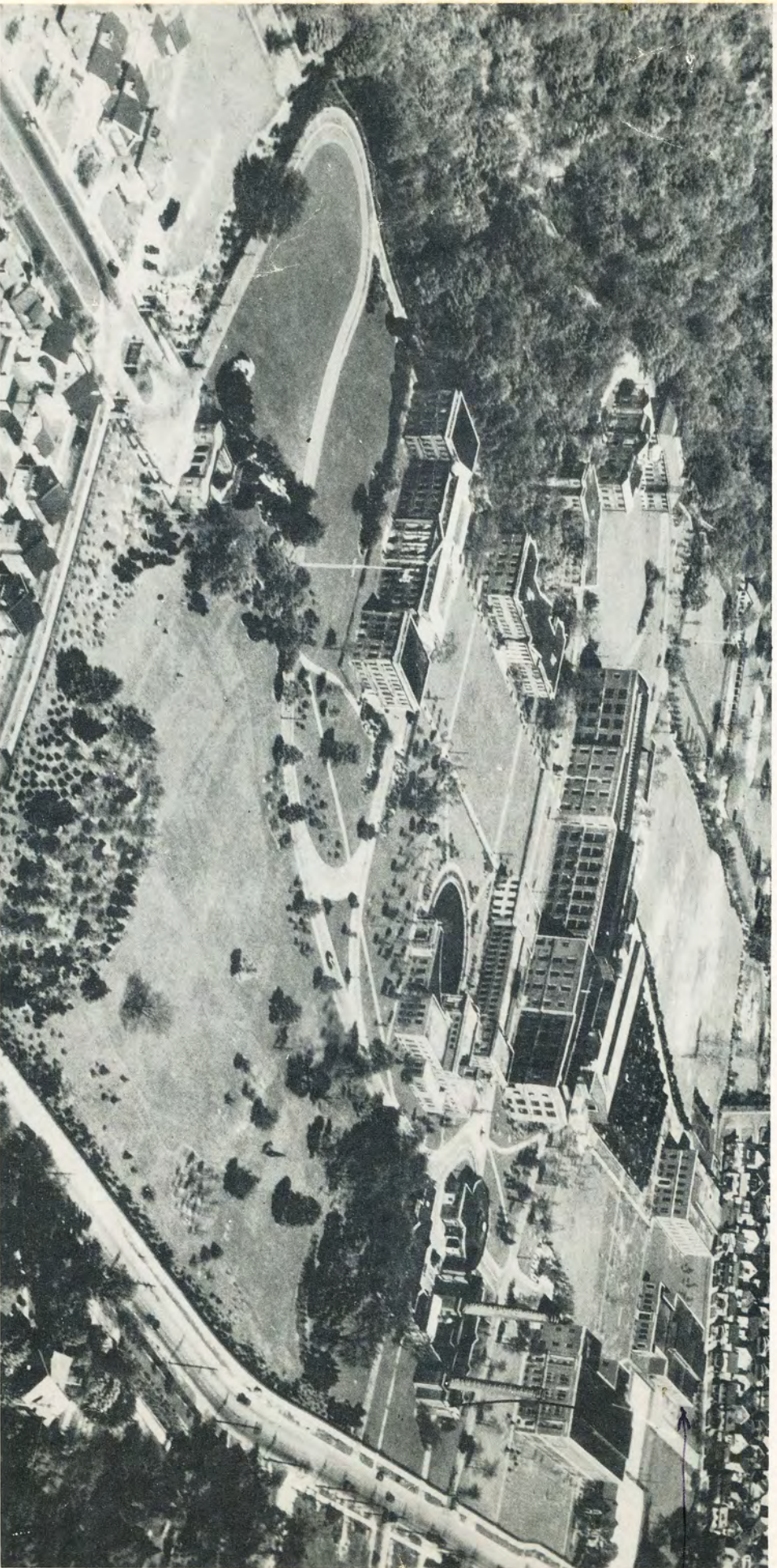

camps. Some of the propaganda
nonsense with which they have
been filled is indicated by questions
they have asked their captors about
affairs in Russia and Japan.

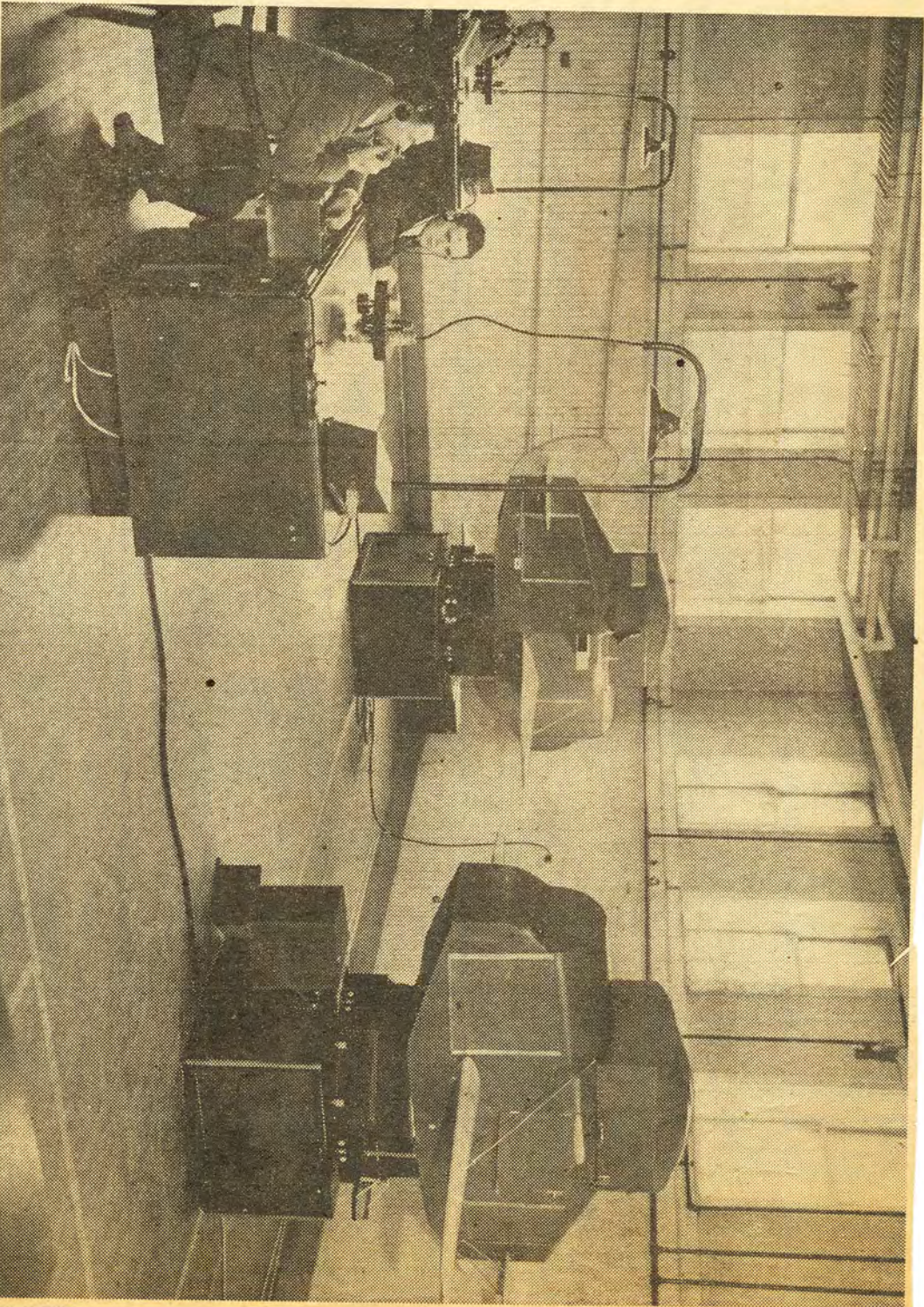
The lies on which they were fed
at home for 10 years seem to have
been concentrated and specialized
for support of their morale. Perhaps
some great lie that they have not
yet revealed will explain this sud-
den break in fighting morale with-
out the expected accompaniment of
a general breaking of the spirit.
Superficially the performance is

The men the army has been train-
