Laws in Brief



To owe three months' dues means suspension and inability to sick or death benefits. Six months' membership entitles you to sick benefits (see Section 165) and twelve months to death benefits (see Section 187).

No member can draw more than eight weeks' sick benefits in one year, AND HE MUST NOTIFY THE FINANCIAL SECRETARY WITHIN ONE WEEK AFTER THE BEGINNING OF SICKNESS. Traveling members in good standing will receive their benefits by depositing their cards in the nearest Union.

Sick benefits are not to be paid for first week of sickness or for any fractional part of a week.

... Remember ...

Always cancel the stamp with dater after you have stuck it in its proper place, and see that your rubber stamp bears the correct date.

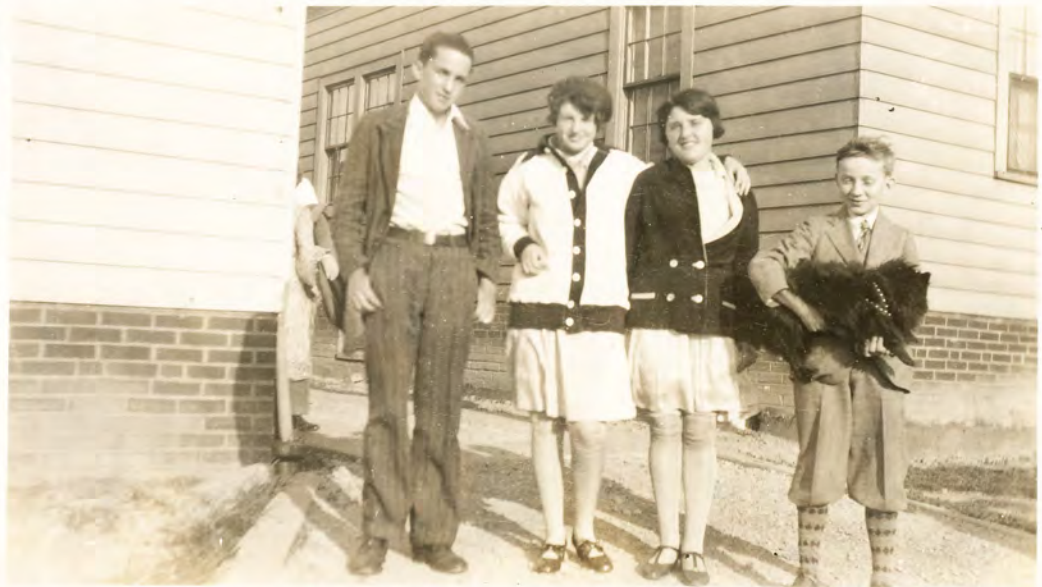

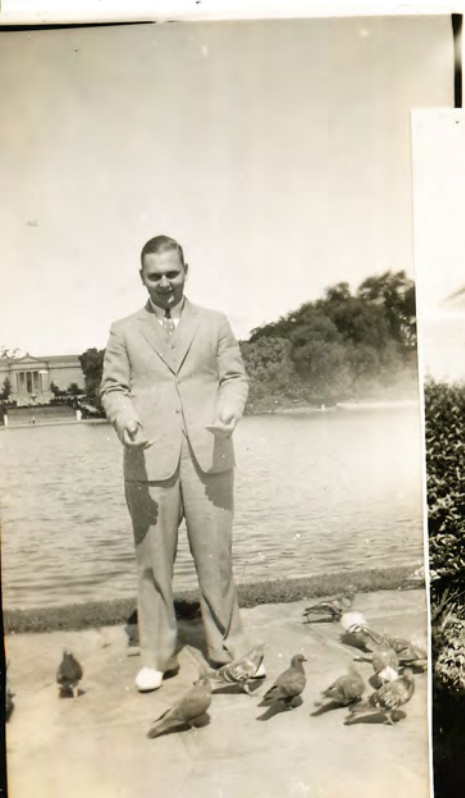

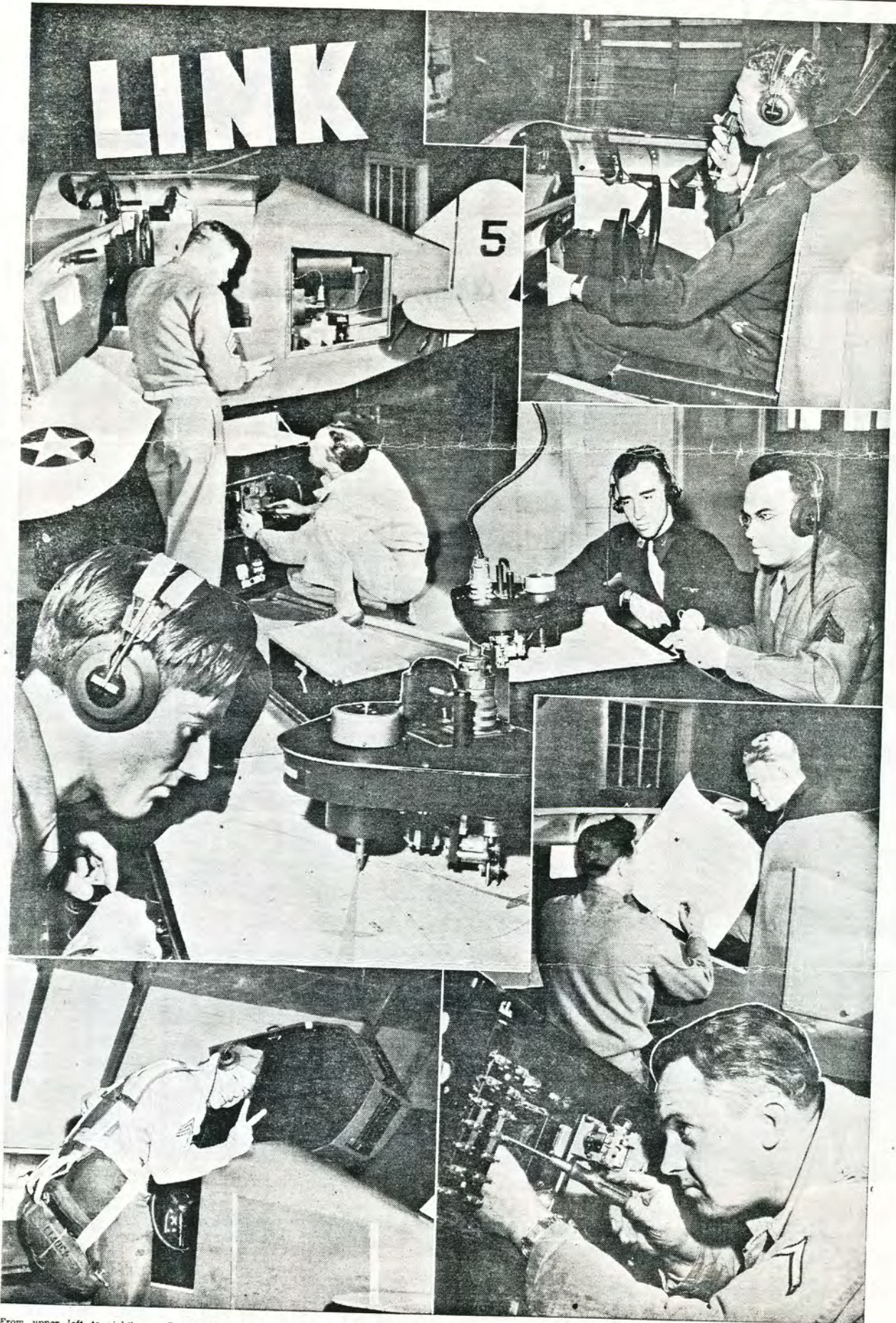

Justifiably proud of having pro-

vided each of MAAF's graduating classes with an average of 4500 hours of "Link time," is the Instrument Flying Trainer Department, headed by Capt. Curtis D. Ashenhurst and his assistant, Lt. Norman S. Davis.

In the entire department there are only 55 men, and they are doing the work which at one time was done by approximately 80 men. These 55 men have been assigned to the three Link Trainer buildings to work in their capacity either as instructors

or as maintenance men. M/Sgt. Frank C. Bourne serves as chief instructor, and T/Sgt. Ben Freshman as administrative NCO.
